Join Art Bytes to champion the creativity of the nation's next generation using art and virtual technology, raising aspirations for better futures.



ABOUT

Art Bytes is a national EdTech programme that utilises a bespoke, immersive, virtual gallery to give young participants the opportunity to see their art exhibited online and engage with new technology from the safety and convenience of their own home or school. It builds confidence and nurtures talent, allows children and young people to see galleries as places "for them" and encourages future cultural engagement. After a shortlisting panel and an online public vote, the winning artist

from each school sees their work displayed in our virtual gallery. Art Bytes culminates every June with a celebration event at a high-profile cultural venue in each of the nine regions of England, which is also available to schools to stream in the classroom or assembly. National and Regional winners are announced, certificates and prizes are presented, and the virtual gallery goes live. The competition is open to all primary (year 5), secondary (year 9) and SEND schools across Enaland.

WHY?

Art is the perfect way for students to process their thoughts and feelings when trying to make sense of the world and their place in it. Participating in Art Bytes also provides a key part of the recovery process for pupils coping with the effects of the pandemic. The positive impact of our programme on students' mental health and well-being has been proven. Research carried out by Liverpool Hope University and Curious Minds of Art Bytes forerunner programme, dot-art

Schools, showed that taking part nurtures children and young peoples' creativity and boosts their confidence. We learnt that the students gain a measurable sense of self-respect from the process. Participating in the competition can also raise students' aspirations and engage student's families. We know that the pandemic has increased the disadvantage gap markedly; engaging with Art Bytes helps build valuable cultural capital in students.

TEN REASONS TO TAKE PART

- Contributes to a broad and balanced curriculum which build students cultural capital (included in the new Education Inspection Framework)
- Increase pupil's self-esteem, particularly important with the growing mental health crisis facing young people, which has been magnified during lockdown.
- Help close the disadvantage gap, which has been significantly widened by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Raise your school's profile regionally and nationally and demonstrate the school's commitment to arts and creativity.
- Fantastic opportunity to showcase your student's artwork outside school.

WHEN?

| Sept to Dec | Schools sign up to participate in Art Bytes. |
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| February | Schools submit photographs of students' artworks by half term. Competition entries are added to the school's portfolio page on the Art Bytes website. |
| March | Judging panel of respected arts professionals shortlist the top 3 entries from each school. |
| April | The public vote online for their favourite shortlisted entry. The entry with most votes from each school wins a place in the virtual exhibition. |
| May / June | Guest judges select National and Regional winners for each region. Students, families and teachers are invited to a celebration event at their nearest partner venue, where the winners are announced. This can also be streamed to schools. Art Bytes Virtual Exhibition opens to the public. |
